"Drama 1." Annually.

An exploration of theatre within a historical and cultural context. Emphasis on the development of performance skills and creative self-expression using a variety of topics and methods, including storytelling, pantomime, improvisation, moving on the stage, Greek Theater, Commedia dell'Arte, monologue and scene work, performance critiques, and musical theatre.

"Drama 2." Annually.

Continuing theatre students gain additional experience in dramatic arts through acting, and technical theatre, while still focusing on a historical and cultural context. Topics include accent work, character development, Shakespeare, continued monologue and scene work, points of view in storytelling through the Roshoman effect, increased development of performance critiques, creative theatrical writing projects, and research-driven musical theatre projects focused on the mid-late 20th century.

"Stagecraft." Annually.

The focus is on creating a firm foundation in technical theatre. Students examine all technical aspects of the production process. Units of study will include, theatre history, design, set construction, props, lighting, sound, costume and make-up, advertising, and stage management. The course is repeatable and provides the ability to refine knowledge and skill set.

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"Advanced Drama/Honors." Annually.

Providing deeper development as a student of theatre. This course is a production class. Participate in multiple public performances, which are developed by the students. We will not Engagement with drama and theater moves from viewer and participant to creator. There is an exploration of direction, dramaturgy, use of Shakespeare and current applications, contemporary playwrights, the development of original works of theatre through playwriting and devising, and examine the technical side of theatre. Theater research is extended through special projects as well as in the research-driven musical theatre projects focused on the late 20th century-21st century.

The honors course is geared toward students who have demonstrated a unique commitment to Drama and who strive for additional and extensive Theatre Arts challenges. For the Honors designation, students complete capstone projects (i.e. write and/or direct a play) and additional academic papers each semester in addition to the Advanced Drama coursework.

"English Credit Recovery." Annually.

- Facilitated instruction in English at 9th, 10th, 11th, and 12th grades for credit recovery.
